

**April Athletic Council Meeting Minutes**  
**April 6, 2022**  
**Guidance Conference Room**  
**Keystone High School**

1. Reviewed and approved the minutes from the March 16, 2022 Athletic Council Meeting.
2. Recommendation to post/advertise for a Girl's Varsity Soccer Head Coach.
3. Recommendation to post/advertise for a Junior High Co-Ed Soccer Head Coach.
4. There have been 8 games secured for the Junior High Soccer Team, which will be held in the fall. During the 2022-2023 School Year, the soccer games will be held as triple headers due to official shortages and scheduling issues. Games will be played during the week and on Saturdays as well.
5. Discussion took place regarding the future of the Head Coaching Position for Varsity Cheerleading. The possibility of seeking out a Competitive Spirit Co-Op was also discussed, but was tabled as the need for a Co-Op would be dependent upon what takes place with the cheer coaching position. It was also discussed that in hope of returning to Competitive Spirit, the budget should be reviewed to determine if funding for competitions and equipment is available. It was also suggested that the current equipment, such as the mats, should be inspected to determine if they are still in good condition for the program.
6. The future of the Athletic Director Position for the 2022-2023 school year was discussed. This will be revisited next month when other positions have been filled within the district.
7. Uniform Update: new uniforms have been ordered for the Varsity Football Program from Under Armour. Fifty uniforms, home and away jerseys and pants, were ordered at a cost of \$9300. Mr. Iriwn has also obtained a bid for Baseball and Junior High Soccer uniforms as well.
8. Recommended to approve the ability for the baseball and softball teams to have the option of holding games and/or practices off site if the district fields are unable to be utilized. At this point and time, baseball has not been able to practice on the field yet due to weather and the condition of the field. The teams would be permitted to utilize the Knox Little League Fields at Peanut Park and the Clarion County Fields at the Clarion County Park.
