

June Athletic Council Meeting Minutes
June 6, 2023
Guidance Conference Room
Keystone Jr.-Sr. High School

Members present: Mr. Beary, Mr. Slagle, Mr. Say, Mr. Hall, Mr. Willison, Mr. Irwin, Mr. Best, and Mrs. McNaughton.

1. It was recommended to schedule Junior High Head Cheerleader Interviews.
2. It was recommended to accept Dalton Schultz's resignation as Head Varsity Cheer Coach.
3. It was recommended to accept Ashley Custer's letter of resignation as Head Junior High Volleyball Coach.
4. It was recommended to accept Bobbie Heller's resignation as an Assistant Girls' Track Coach and to recommend hiring her as a program volunteer coach.
5. It was recommended to hire Colin Say as a program volunteer for Boys' Basketball.
6. It was recommended to post/advertise for a Head Varsity Cheer Coach.
7. It was recommended to post/advertise for a Head Junior High Volleyball Coach.
8. There was a discussion regarding holding Sunday activities at the school (practices). There have been situations when this has happened (ex. playoff situations and extenuating circumstances). This has only happened in rare occasions because according to PIAA rules, there can only be six days of activity for each sport per week. Activities on Sundays have not been mandatory.
9. A discussion was held regarding the use of outside, older players being permitted to be used for scrimmages. Mr. Irwin was going to double check the PIAA Rulebook, but his recollection was that this practice is not permissible. A further examination of the interpretation of the rules, showed that this was in fact against the PIAA regulations.
10. It was agreed upon to move forward with the uniform rotation that Mr. Irwin and Mr. Willison had created. This will be in conjunction with a donor purchasing new uniforms for all volleyball and basketball teams.
11. A discussion was held regarding possibly opportunities for a co-op for Varsity Boys' Soccer. Mr. Irwin reached out to two local districts to get clarification on the logistics and will report back in a timely fashion so that a recommendation can be made by the Athletic Council and be presented to the School Board later this month.

12. An issue regarding a baseball coaching issue was discussed. The Council discussed the matter at length and a plan was developed to move the program forward in a positive manner.
